stats SINCE TRAINING...



- 82% have increased use of toolkit
- 82% keep neglect on their agenda
- 82% are now more professionally curious
- 73% used a chronology more
- 73% now share more information with other agencies
- 36% are identifying neglect earlier
- 36% now refer to the continuum of need
- 27% have used what they learnt about brain development
- 18% have updated their resources
- 1% have used ecomapping

Improvements you would like to see on the Neglect Toolkit

- Too lengthy - education not always a concern in families where neglect is present
- More focus on Educational Neglect
- The word 'neglect' creates a barrier when working with families

Improvements you would like to see on the Neglect Training

- What a good one looks like
- Make more accessible to health workers
- Focus on how to fill out the form and what information is required and what to do with it
- Professional curiosity - when and how to use it
